- 4. Vancouver Chinese Music Ensemble: Famous for breaking the rules and 'grafting' diverse cultural traditions into something new.
- 5. Vancouver Okinawa Taiko: Multi-generational performers who drum and dance to contemporary and traditional Okinawan music
- 6. The Carnival Band: Nothing says spring energy like this Commercial Drive brass band. Cherry salsa anyone?
- 7. Revel in "petals falling" from Burrard Station's famous "akebono" cherry trees
- 8. Start photographing cherry blossoms for a chance to win two round-trip tickets to Japan on All Nippon Airways.
- 9. Tell your friends you were part of the official "Vancouver Cherry Blossom Festival Day", as proclaimed by Mayor Gregor Robertson.

## 10. It's free!

The Cherry Jam Downtown Concert officially kicks a month of festivities which include Tree Talks & Walks, Bike the Blossoms, Plein Air Painting Workshops and Plein Air Challenge, Cherry Scouting, and the ever popular evening immersive display of Sakura Illumination (scheduled for Queen Elizabeth Park, March 26<sup>th</sup> 7-10pm. Immerse the entire family in Japanese culture at the Sakura Days Japan Fair in VanDusen Botanical Garden, April 9-10.

New this year are 2-hour guided neighbourhood Blossom Bus TRAMS tours and a spectacular festival wrap-up with the floating Blossom Barge sailing from Crab Park to Granville Island on April 16. The vessel will have 36 flowering cherry trees on board and its arrival will kick off two days of free performances including Tetsu Taiku & Tzo'kam, Vancouver Metropolitan Orchestra, Langley Ukulele Ensemble, Kutapira, Chibi Taiko, and the international yoyo superstar - Harrison Lee.

If you're a Festival fan with a vessel, join the Blossom Barge Flotilla on April 17<sup>th</sup>. Put on your pink, blossom up your crew and follow the Blossom Barge out of False Creek.

While the Vancouver Cherry Blossom Festival is in full bloom you can bring the beauty of the cherry tree into your own garden by going to <a href="www.vcbf.ca">www.vcbf.ca</a> and reserving one of eight, early to late-blooming varieties of flowering cherries called Birthday Blossoms. These four year old, exceptional quality trees will be available for pick up at VanDusen Botanical Garden on the weekend of April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2016.
