

Springtime in Vancouver is one of the most incredibly beautiful times of year. After the dreariness of countless days and nights of non-stop rain, an amazing thing happens. The rays of a sun that we believed may be gone forever suddenly breaks through the gray skies. At last count, it is estimated that the City of Vancouver has at least 37,000 Cherry trees, and the Cherry Blossom Festival, which was started in 2005 by Festival Founder and Director, Linda Poole, is a way for Vancouverites to express their gratitude for these beautiful gifts and the happiness the beauty of their blooms bring to the hearts of many Vancouverites.

Now seven years later, the Cherry Festival incorporates a number of fun & wonderful events aimed at involving everyone in the city in celebrating the blossoms. There are musical performances, city-wide viewing programs such as "Bike the Blossoms", or guided walking tours of Festival Favorites, and homages to these beautiful trees in the form of music, poetry, photography, arts & crafts and cuisine. Vancouverites have flocked to these events with more and more interest and the festival has grown, fostering community spirit, bringing many of our diverse cultures together in celebration.


