

## DEFINITIVE GUIDEBOOK TO VANCOUVER'S 40,000 CHERRY TREES LAUNCHING NOV 26<sup>TH</sup>

19 new varieties of cherry trees discovered in Metro Vancouver since 2011

**VANCOUVER, BC (Nov. 20, 2013)** – On Tuesday, November 26<sup>th</sup>, the Vancouver Cherry Blossom Festival will launch **Ornamental Cherries in Vancouver**, a definitive guidebook to Vancouver's 40,000 flowering cherry trees, which for nearly 100 years have attracted residents and visitors and helped make Vancouver one of the world's most beautiful and livable cities.

The guidebook, written by Douglas Justice, Associate Director & Curator of Collections UBC Botanical Garden, will provide detailed information, beautiful photos as well as specific locations, for Vancouver's 54 varieties (or cultivars) of blossoming trees, including nineteen new cultivars discovered since the previous guidebook was published in 2011. Justice provides the history, distinctive markings, photos and locations for each cultivar, including the recently discovered and sublime Ito-kukuri, whose history dates back to 1681 in Japan, the very fragrant Hosokowa-nioi and the exceptionally rare Choshu-hizakura, of which only a single tree is known to be growing in the Vancouver area.

The new edition of the guidebook includes newly discovered locations to find cherry cultivars across Vancouver, a Chinese index and a Japanese index, and information on how some of the rarest cultivars are being successfully micropropagated in the BCIT Biotechnology Program in collaboration with Vancouver Park Board and UBC Botanical Garden.

The timing of the publication coincides with the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Japanese Consulate General in Vancouver. The Vancouver Cherry Blossom Festival congratulates the Japanese Consulate and gives thanks to our sister city of Yokohama and Kobe for gifting 500 ornamental cherry trees to Vancouver in the 1930s.

Ornamental Cherries in Vancouver, will play an indispensable role throughout the year for the Cherry Blossom Festival's Cherry Scouts, who search for the blossoms and provide valuable feedback to the "What's Blooming Now" page on the festival's website and the UBC Botanical Garden online forum. While most cherry trees bloom between February to May, the first ones, 'Autumnalis', will actually begin blooming in late December.
